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The following information outlines the required tasks associated with our Special Fundraising Dinners:

Saturday Morning Food Preparation (2-4 people)

- The morning food preparation runs from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. depending upon the number of people available to assist in the kitchen.
- Duties include:
 - Cleaning, peeling and chopping food. For example potatoes, carrots, onions and other veggies as needed.
 - Keeping up with cleaning of the dishes as you go along.

Saturday Morning Hall Set Up (4 people)

- Hall set up normally runs from about 10:00 a.m. to noon.
- Duties include:
 - Wrapping up cutlery into napkins.
 - Cleaning tables and setting them up with salt, pepper, sugar, cutlery, cups and saucers.
 - Cleaning and preparation of containers for water, coffee and tea in preparation for the next day.

Sunday Morning Meal Preparation (4 people)

- Meal preparation normally runs from 8:30 a.m. to 1 p.m. depending upon the number of people available to assist in the kitchen and the type of food being prepared.
- Duties include:
 - Assisting the kitchen lead with preparing the dishes being served.
 - Setting up the buffet table and putting out condiments.
 - Keeping up with cleaning of dishes as you go along.

Serving & Clean Up (10- 13 people)

- Normally runs from 5 p.m. to 8 p.m.
- Duties include:
 - Runners and food servers at the buffet table (3-6 people).
 - Preparing and serving coffee and tea, replenishing sugar and creamers as required (3 people)
 - Clearing away dirty dishes and wiping down tables (4 people)
 - At the end of the meal, items from the tables are collected and put away and tables are cleaned.

Dishwashing (4 people)

- This is normally done between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.
- Two people at the input side to remove the dirty dishes from the carts and organize them to go through the dishwasher.
- Two people at the output side to remove the dishes and put them away.
