Lord Jesus, open the Scriptures to us; make our hearts burn with love when you speak.

The gospel tells us how Christ opened the minds of the disciples to the understanding of the scriptures. He explained why he had to suffer and rise from the dead on the third day. Moreover, they were to be his witnesses, preaching penance for the remission of sins, to all nations.
