Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness: there he was tempted.

In the desert Jesus is confronted by the forces of evil on three occasions and is subjected to severe temptations in the depth of his soul. The devil meets him face to face and, in an effort to turn him away from God's plan of redemption, offers him false happiness with enticements of security, power and fame. None of these temptations got the better of him and he emerged victorious, but after a prolonged struggle. Temptation is a real test and the worst thing about it is that it is always an attraction. When tired and

hungry, it would have been easy for Jesus to turn stones into bread for his own comfort and allow his feelings to influence his actions. The temptations of Christ are those faced by all Christians. They test our faith and force us to make decisions either for or against God. As followers of Christ, we must be ready to stand and be counted as we are constantly at risk from the evil one. Because Jesus experienced temptation himself, he understands us in our weaknesses and is there to give us hope and encouragement.
